Jason Tang graduated with a Bachelor of Music (Honours) degree with first-class honours from the Royal Academy of Music in London, where he studied organ performance with Prof. David Titterington and choral conducting with Prof. Patrick Russill under full scholarship. He is currently pursuing his Master of Music degree at the Academy with Prof. David Titterington, where his studies are generously supported by the Royal Academy of Music's scholarship, The Countess of Munster Musical Trust, The Eric Thompson Trust, The Champniss Foundation, and Help Musicians.

At the Academy, Jason has participated in masterclasses with Bine Bryndorf, Paul Goussot, Daniel Roth, and Dong-Ill Shin. He has achieved top marks in his undergraduate recital and has been awarded major prizes, most notably the Regency Award for all-round contribution and achievement, Sir Elton John Award, Stephen Bicknell Prize, The Timothy Bowers Academic Achievement Award, and more. Jason also won first prizes in the Dorothy Cooper Organ Prize in 2022 and the Peter le Huray Organ Prize for Baroque Music in 2024, and he holds the LRAM teaching diploma from the Academy. Besides, Jason was a finalist in the Northern Ireland International Organ Competition in 2023.

Prior to his studies at the Academy, Jason was one of six participants admitted to the 52nd International Organ Festival Haarlem Young Talent Programme in 2018. In this programme, he had the privilege of studying with renowned organ professors, including Leo van Doeselaar, Lorenzo Ghielmi, Jean-Baptiste Robin, Ben van Oosten, and Louis Robilliard.

Jason is currently the Organ Scholar at St. Mary's, Bourne Street, under the direction of Richard Pinel. He has previously held positions at Christ Church, Spitalfields, and Grosvenor Chapel, Mayfair, where he accompanied and occasionally directed the Chapel Choir for their weekly services. Recent recital engagements include performances at Neresheim Abbey; Westminster Central Hall; St. George's Hanover Square, London; Church of Notre Dame de France RC, London; Cathedral Basilica of St. Bavo, Haarlem; Korskirken, Bergen; St John's Cathedral, Hong Kong; and the Hong Kong Cultural Centre.
